Tennessee to Texas, stages from Missouri to Maine, Horace has sung soulful ballads to Broadway standards. He has been compared to legendary artists such as Luther Vandross and Barry White with titles like Never Too Much, Let's Get It On. While in theatre, he starred in productions of SHOWBOAT singing the classic, Ol' Man River. He also starred as Coalhouse Walker in RAGTIME & Jim in BIG RIVER. Here in St. Louis, you may remember him as Big Moe in FIVE GUYS NAMED MOE at St. Louis Black Repertory Theatre. These are just a few of the productions in Horace's very extensive theatrical background.



Like Horace, **Illy** has performed love songs of various genres from coast to coast. She was last seen at

the Playhouse at Westport in 2019 as Gary Coleman (Broadway World Nomination) in AVENUE Q. She starred as Deloris Van Cartier in SISTER ACT, the Musical (Broadway World Nomination) and as Caroline in CAROLINE, OR CHANGE (Broadway World Nomination). Her theatrical experience includes productions of AIN'T MISBEHAVIN', GODSPELL, JOSEPH & THE AMAZING TECHNICOLOR DREAMCOAT, SHOWBOAT, SOUTH PACIFIC, THE DROWSY CHAPERONE to name a few. She is also a director, choreographer and songwriter and currently working on her debut CD with a hopeful release in 2023.

The Heartstrings Band Musical Director/Keyboard Charlie Mueller

Charlie Mueller is thrilled to return to The Playhouse at Westport Plaza for his third show as Music Director (previously Flanagan's Wake and Avenue Q). Charlie is a music director, music educator, and pianist who works throughout the St. Louis area. He is currently the Education Programs Manager at The Muny, where he also serves as the Music Director and Arranger for the Muny Teens. He has served as a music director and arranger for many local

theater companies such as Repertory Theatre of St. Louis, New Jewish Theatre, Insight Theatre Company, Theater Nuevo, ERA, West End Players Guild, and COCA. He previously served as the Director of Vocal Music at CBC High School and the Artistic Director of Allegro, a vocal music company, at COCA, where he has also served as a member of the vocal music faculty. He served as Tenor section leader at First Congregational Church of St. Louis and Baritone section leader at First Presbyterian Church of Kirkwood. He has been an adjunct faculty member and music director at both Webster University and Saint Louis University. Charlie received his BA from Saint Louis University in Communication and Music and then went on to receive his MA from Webster University in Choral Conducting.

Brass - Joe Akers

Joe Akers teaches elementary music in the Mehlville School District and is also the Adjunct Instructor of Trumpet at Saint Louis University. He has his own trumpet studio and teaches students throughout the St. Louis area. Joe has played shows with Stray Dog Theatre, Fly North Theatricals, Gateway Center for the Performing Arts, and New Line Theatre. When not playing or teaching, he helps raise and train service dogs for CHAMP Service Dogs with his family.

Guitar- Dave Black

If you're a native of St. Louis, you may recognize the name Dave Black as one of the area's most versatile and in-demand guitarists, having performed and recorded with artists/groups from numerous genres, including Jazz, Rock, Blues and World Folk! Dave also teaches Jazz Guitar and directs Jazz Ensemble at Webster University.

Drums - Bernard Long Jr.

The late Bernard Long, Sr., sensed Jr. 's love and feel for music and introduced him to the world of music at age 4. Bernard, Jr. graduated with his B.M. in Jazz Studies in May 2009 from Northern Illinois University under the leadership of Professor Ron Carter. Bernard, Jr. performed in the world renowned NIU Jazz Ensemble toured with greats like Clark Terry, Benny Golson, Rodney Whitaker, and Peter Erskine. Bernard Jr. graduated from Michigan State University in May 2012 with his M.M. in Jazz Studies. At MSU Bernard, Jr. directed the MSU Jazz Orchestra 3, and performed with the MSU Jazz Orchestra 1. Bernard, Jr. graduated from Lindenwood University in May 2016 with his MAT in Music Education, and with his Ed.S. in School Administration in December 2018. Bernard, Jr. is an Adjunct Professor of Jazz drum set at Lindenwood University. Bernard, Jr. is the band director at Madison Jr/Sr High School in Madison, IL

where he started the music program via zoom in 2020. Bernard is a 2016 graduate of the Focus St. Louis emerging leaders' class. Bernard has been teaching students for 20 years. Bernard, Jr is a 2018 honoree of the Salute to Excellence in Education class sponsored by the St. Louis American Foundation. Bernard is a member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity; INC. Bernard is the Illinois Music Educators Association district 6 percussion representative. Bernard Jr is on the Percussive Arts Society Education and Diversity committee. Bernard, Jr. is the percussionist for Third Presbyterian Church.

Reeds - Brandon Thompson

Brandon is a professional musician who specializes in woodwind doubling (saxophone/clarinet/flute) and music directing. He is currently an Operations Lead for team Nissan at Ansira Inc. He has a Bachelor of Arts in Music Education from Lindenwood University where he studied for five years. He now lives in Maryland Heights with his partner, Peter, and his dog, Colby. Brandon is excited to experience his first show with Westport Playhouse.

Bass - Willem von Hombracht

Willem von Hombracht has been playing bass since 1977; studied at the Arnhem Conservatory of Music in the Netherlands, and has had a strong presence on the St. Louis music scene since the 1990s.

Though he is most often to be heard in jazz-related performances, he is also active in many other settings, including blues, rock, classical, folk, Brazilian, Cuban, Mexican, and West African groups, as well as a wide variety of theater productions. He often collaborates on projects with poets, dancers, actors, and painters.

Though based in St. Louis, and most often engaged in this region, he has also traveled quite extensively throughout North America, Europe and West Africa, both as a performer and as a teacher. Since 2003 Willem has been adjunct professor of jazz studies at Webster University, and since 2001 he has been on the faculty of the International Summer Jazz Academy in Kraków (Poland).

He has been featured on over 25 CD recordings, on both US and European labels.

Willem has been a part of several productions here at the Playhouse and is happy to be returning once again!
